

B'ham Renews Contract For Ambulance Service

Birmingham city commissioners Monday night renewed for one year the City's contract for ambulance service with the Birmingham Ambulance Co., 853 E. Maple.

The contract calls for payment by the City of \$450 per month for two large custom type ambulances to serve the general area.

Actually, commissioners accepted a bid for the service, submitted a low bid of \$350 for the same type of ambulance service and \$200 per month to provide two converted station wagon units.

HOWEVER, commissioners felt that since this company had been in business only one month they would have to wait until the firm gained more experience.

The local company has been under contract with the City since March 23, 1959, and has been in business seven years.

Contract specifications require the company to carry liability insurance of \$100,000 for injury or death to any one party, \$300,000 for any one accident and property damage insurance of \$100,000 with the City as an additional assured.

Arts Festival Wins Approval Of 7 Requests

Birmingham city commissioners Monday night granted seven requests by the Birmingham Arts Festival.

They are:

- 1) A proclamation from the mayor establishing June 17-24 as Birmingham Arts Festival Week. (This will be the fourth annual event.)
- 2) Permission to serve light refreshments out-of-doors behind Kreager's store and on the sidewalk in front of Machus Restaurant.
- 3) Closing of the parking lot behind Kreager's during the festival for an outdoor cafe and for one of the art activities tents.
- 4) Closing Henrietta from the alley between Martin and Maple to Martin and location of a second art activities tent.
- 5) Closing of three parking spaces in front of Machus Restaurant for placement of a row of hooded shrubs to provide atmosphere for the sidewalk cafe without restricting pedestrian movement.
- 6) Permission to erect decorative arts pylons, loaned by the Ford Tractor plant, at the intersection of Martin and Henrietta streets.
- 7) Permission to erect decorative kiosks (ornamental pavilions) around light poles in the downtown area.

The requests were made by R. R. Owen, festival general chairman.

Troy Starts Plans For \$11 Million Sanitary Sewers

Legal negotiations for an \$11-million sanitary sewer construction project were started last week by the Troy City Commission.

The commission's action will allow the Oakland County Department of Public Works to install a complete system of sanitary sewer trunklines in Troy.

A tax increase to pay off all existing sewer debts and authorization for the city to enter contract negotiations with the DPW was adopted in recent sessions.

THE COMMISSIONERS agreed to levy a city-wide tax of 1.8 mills during the 1961-62 fiscal year in addition to the regular tax rate of five mills.

According to City Manager David E. Freston, the \$11 million would be reduced to 1.56 mills during 1962-63 and would be crossed off the books in 1967-68.
