

## Rec Commission Offers Tennis, Charm Classes

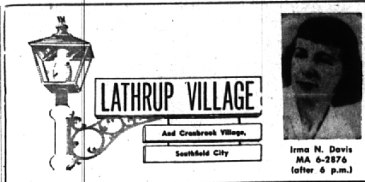
