Municipalities Get Motor Vehicle Highway Funds

Michigan's motor vehicle highway fund received \$212,415.71 from state gasoline taxes and license plate fees during the fiscal year that ended June 30, according to the State Highway Department. This represented an increase of 1.1 per cent compared to \$209,090,158 received during the 1959-60 fiscal year.
Seventeen counties received \$1 million or more from the highway fund during the 1961 fiscal year. Oakland county received \$4,320,617.

MANAGING DIRECTOR Howard E. Hill said the Highway Department received \$39,759,538 from the fund while the state's 83 counties shared \$74,284,549 and the 510 incorporated cities and villages shared \$32,202,842.
By law, the Highway Department receives 47 per cent of the money deposited in the highway fund while the counties receive 35 per cent and the cities 18 per cent.

UNDER MICHIGAN'S constitution, gasoline taxes and license plate fees are earmarked for highway construction and maintenance purposes.
The money is distributed to counties and cities on the basis of population and county road or city street mileage.
