This kind of hospitality does have its limits, though. For years the association held a community Halloween party, complete with torch-light parades, free carnival, doughnuts and cider. Over popular, it died of exhaustion and overcrowding.

**THE MUCH AMENDED** by-law reflect the steady change in the needs of the community and the necessities of the change by the association leaders.

But as 20th century minded as they are, there's one change they steadfastly refuse to consider. The little woman will never be a card-carrying member.

She can grace their parties; make phone calls to help sell tickets; stand over a hot serving line at the Roundup; play in the band . . . but the Franklin Community association is for Men Only. After all, you have to draw a line somewhere.
