insurance and real estate; construction and trade contractors; government, local, state and federal; transportation and public utilities; and agriculture, forestry, fisheries and kindred categories.

EACH CATEGORY was further broken down in the MESC survey to include seven major occupational groups. These are clerical and sales occupations; professional and managerial occupations; service; agricultural, fishery, forestry and kindred occupations; unskilled; skilled; and semi-skilled occupations. The labor market information gained from the survey will be used to ascertain labor employment needs of the various employers.

Tritt said the commission has expected the employment total in the combined two cities to be about 12,000-8,000; instead, more than 12,000 turned up in the report.

Suggestion for Lincoln Draws Local Objection

E. H. Krauss, 1800 W. Lincoln, Birmingham, has voiced objection to Beverly Hills City Commission's suggestion to use Birmingham streets as alternate routes to the proposed extension of 14 Mile Road.

Birmingham commissioners instructed City Manager J. R. Gare to write Krauss to inform him that the City's position has been made known to the Oakland County Road Commission.

Birmingham commissioners favor extending 14 Mile all the way to Telegraph, whereas the county has proposed opening it from Southfield Road to Cranbrook.

that the county consider use of Sighthelm north of 14 Mile and expansion of Lincoln.

In his letter to Birmingham, Krauss said: "Beverly Hills objects to the use of their residential streets and the possible increase in traffic on Riverside but have no objection on the use of Lincoln Road, which is also a residential street, for the same purpose."

"Lincoln Road deadends at Cranbrook and in no sense would answer the same purpose as 14 Mile Road."

KRAUSS SAID that as a resident of Lincoln he would "certainly be against removing the center parkway as suggested by Beverly Hills and I know all of my neighbors and residents (Birmingham) of the adjacent property concern."

Birmingham Commissioner Carl Ingraham suggested that the city manager write Krauss and inform him of the City's position.

He said it is "not in our plans to include Lincoln in the road improvement program."

were competent, I was assured that the man would stay on the job and that the operation would be compatible with the administration of the City.

"I think we are entering into a new era as far as civil defense is concerned. My own personal opinion is that civil defense is here to stay and it will become an integral part of government."

"A civil defense director to do a competent job must be a well trained individual. Before this person starts functioning, it will be necessary that he undergo a considerable training period."

"UNDOUBTEDLY, the City is going to spend not only money but also a considerable amount of time in seeing that this person is prepared to handle his duties."

"It is, therefore, incumbent that whoever accepts this job must be prepared to stay on it for a considerable amount of time."

If the director is to be a volunteer, Gare said, about the only person who could afford to take the job would be a retiree, probably a person of advanced age.

"This job is going to involve much evening work with a very busy and heavy schedule. It seems to me that a younger person would be more desirable for this position."

Gare said he thought "the city manager would possibly have greater control" over a CD director if he were a paid employee rather than a volunteer.
