Belated Gift Fulfills 3-Year-Old Threat

Sure enough—Maryann showed up on Maple last week—with the pig.

NAMED CLEOPATRA by her new companion, the pig has been a standing joke since Maryann's graduation from Bloomfield Hills High in 1958.

A friend of the family, Mrs. Donald A. Young, 376 Dunston, Bloomfield Hills, threatened to satisfy Maryann's insatiable craving for pork chops by promising her a pig as a graduation gift.

The years as well as Mrs. Young's threat passed but Maryann never forgot—the subject frequently finding its way into conversations.

FINALLY, MRS. YOUNG launched a pig-hunting campaign about three months ago. "I never realized it was such a chore to find a pig," laughed Mrs.

Young. Existing the help of friends, packing houses, and meat markets, the campaign became a serious and challenging project. Even advertisements placed in northern Michigan publications failed to bring results.

THREE MONTHS of searching finally paid off last week when Cleo was acquired from a Saginaw farm.

TV Show Features Romney, Dykstra

Research Analyst Appointed to Staff Of Local University

Dr. Beaugregard Stubblefield, a research analyst and former head of the University of Liberia mathematics department, has been appointed an associate professor of mathematics at Michigan State University Oakland.

Stubblefield, 38, a native of Texas, received his bachelor of arts and master of arts degrees in mathematics from Prairie View College, Prairie View, Tex., and his master of science degree from the University of Michigan.

He served in Liberia under the United States Department exchange professorship program until 1956 and received his doctor of philosophy degree from the University of Michigan in 1959.

He was an analysis supervisor at the International Electric Corporation, Teaneck, N. J., and a research mathematician at the Detroit Arsenal.
