## Provisions of Library Contract Plan Outlined

"Just what do library contracts provide?" is a question asked with considerable frequency of the board and staff of the Baldwin Public Library in recent days.

The question is the direct result of the new policy on non-resident use of the library adopted by the board in mid-September—a policy looking toward the extension of service from Baldwin to neighboring communities by means of library contracts.

WITHOUT JOINT action, most American libraries probably will never be able to come up to the standards necessary to meet the needs of their constituencies.

# Yes, Taxes Are Too High; But Are Teacher Salaries?

To the Editor:

Opponents of the school millage are leaning heavily on two arguments: taxes are already too high; teachers' salaries are already high enough.

No one will dispute that taxes are high. But is the standard of national defense; yet most Americans seem prepared to pay it. The cost will be considerably higher and part of it will be the increased cost of America's educational program.

As we face the greatest crisis in our history, how can one say our schools are costing too much? What is "too much" in the price of our continued liberty?

IN 1958, Americans spent 27.5

billion dollars on alcoholic beverages and recreation, 20 billion on education. I believe we can afford to spend more on education.

For some people in Birmingham there is a double standard. Anxious to live in a community where the average income is \$10,000, where

one-third of its residents earn in excess of \$16,000 they object to paying the teachers of their children a respectable wage.

I would welcome the opportunity to publicly debate the question: "Is the proposed teachers' salary schedule, \$5,100 to \$9,500, too high for Birmingham?"

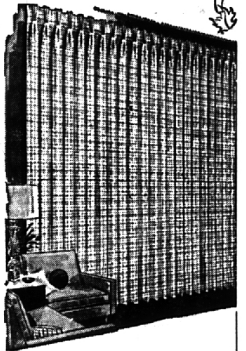
