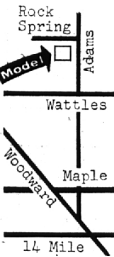

### Franklin Hills Worker Alters Theft Story

**FRANKLIN HILLS**—A Detroit woman, who works as a domestic in a Franklin Hills home, changed her story Tuesday after reporting a \$4,600 purse-snatching Monday night to Detroit police.

Mrs. Hattie Butler, 55, told police a thief grabbed her purse after a struggle in the lobby of the Detroit apartment building in which she lives.

According to her original story, she had withdrawn the money from a bank a few days earlier and planned to use it to buy a home. She said the money was hers.

**AFTER QUESTIONING** Tuesday, she said \$4,600 of the money belonged to a friend, Joseph Franklin, 55, of Highland Park. The balance was hers, she said. She said she and Franklin had planned to be married Tuesday and were going to buy the home together.

Mrs. Butler also amended her story by telling police she had not had a bank account but had kept the money in a potato chip box under the basement stairs in the Franklin Hills home where she worked.
