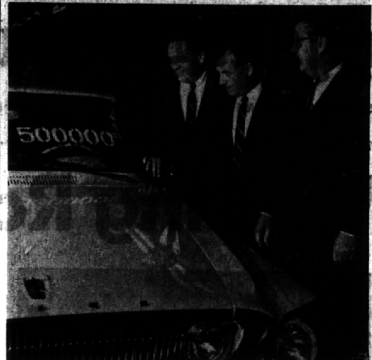


B'ham 12 Town Bonds Delivered

Birmingham's \$1,500,000 general obligation bonds to pay its share of the Twelve Town Drain have been delivered to the purchaser, First of Michigan Corp. Deputy City Treasurer Albert Upward informed city commissioners Monday night that payment was received as follows:

Interest to 11/7/61 \$186.25
TOTAL \$1,500,186.25
 City Manager L. E. Gray said the transaction was handled by Detroit Bank & Trust Co. with-out cost to Birmingham. The money will be used to help pay in advance the City's assessment for the Twelve Town Drain.

NEHRU, I AM INCLINED to believe, is not upset, not alarmed over the present state of mankind but that he does not want people to live better, and in peace... that he believes only the evolutionary methods can be depended upon to raise mankind to win and hold the peaceful, abundant life. That is why he, like Gandhi, is opposed to the use of force in any manner; that must be why he believes that the United States can retain its freedom without the use of atom bombs.

You have but to remember that in his own India, disease and starvation is no stranger to the people. Untold thousands of Indians die upon the streets of his large cities; and gutters at night, as whole families seek slumber, the homeless, sick, emaciated, without hope for a better tomorrow.

Nehru is the spiritual and political leader of such a backward country. Nehru is no stranger to the miseries of life!

TO BE SURE, he is a dedicated crusader for the better life... but his crusading methods are those of Gandhi, the pacifist, the dependent upon non-violence, the opponent of the war-club, the dependent upon the instruments of the mind and the soulful spirit.

well ask for a 2.5-mill increase for operations instead of the stated five-mill increase.

The building proposal for bonding authority would not require additional taxes. The board of education estimates that accumulated reserves, the rate at which bonds from previous building programs are being paid and increasing property valuations will yield sufficient funds to absorb the financial obligations of additional bonds.

WHAT WOULD the school system get in return for the 2.5 mill increase and the \$4,916,000 bond issue?

The combined proposals would provide funds to satisfy pressing school needs that have been snow-balling since 1957 and studied over the past three years.

These needs include expanded curriculum, revised programs, additional teachers and higher teacher salaries to compete with other quality school systems.

In addition, new and remodeled school buildings and facilities would be provided to accommodate enrollment growth and program expansion.

New construction would include two elementary schools, a junior high school and additions to Bar-nam, Fenshake, Bloodfield Villages, Franklin and Harlan schools and a system-wide receiving, storage and delivery facility.

It is estimated that approval of the proposals would relieve school problems over the next three to five years.

It is by no means a final solution, but it is a step in that direction.

can work in Birmingham?" asked the mayor.

Gare said Stacy would have to clear it through the police department, forestry department and Detroit Edison.

"If it is possible and proper at this point to give him the permit, why not before?" Mrs. Willett persisted.

Both Gare and Commissioner William E. Roberts replied: "Because Mr. Stacy has agreed to cut his house down to meet our zoning requirements. He had refused to do so before."

THE MAYOR asked if the City would be in a position of having to sue him if he refused to alter the house once he had it in town.

"This fellow is a different person," she said. "He doesn't operate like other people."

"I'm sorry he's not here to hear my words. I would rather say them to his face."

"He will read it in the paper," said Roberts.

Stacy had been at the meeting earlier but had left before the mayor brought the subject up under the last item on the agenda, general business.

"MR. STACY has succeeded to his end," said Mayor Willett. "I am unhappy about it. I think we are going to be subjected to a lot more criticism when he brings his house into the city."

The City's legal counsel said that if Stacy does comply with the ordinance, there's no worry.

If he doesn't, then he forfeits his \$1,000 bond.

The attorney said the City has no more assurance that Stacy would meet the requirements than it has with any other permit granted.

The City's recourse, he said, would be the same as with any other violation of public relations—it would be forced to sue to get him to comply.

This, Mrs. Willett didn't like because as matters stood before the permit was issued if any suing was to be done it would have had to be by Stacy.

She didn't like the idea of having the shoes on the other foot.
