CITY OF BIRMINGHAM
ORDINANCE NO. 574
 AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE
 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3.3 OF ORDINANCE NO. 527 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM AND THE ZONING MAP, BY ADDITION OF A SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 3.3-23.
 THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM ORDAINS:
 Section 1. That Section 3.3 of Article 3 of Ordinance No. 527 be amended by addition of a section to be known as Section 3.3-23, said Section to read as follows:
 Section 3.3-23. Property at 707 Knox Street described as follows:
 City of Birmingham, Oakland County, Michigan—Assessor's Plat No. 20—Being a plat of part of SE 1/4 Sec. 25, T 2 N, R 10 E—Part of Lot #2 described as beginning at the NE corner of Lot #2, thence S 2° 04' 30" E 119.21 ft.; thence S 87° 54' 50" W 60 ft.; thence N 2° 04' 30" W 119.19 ft.; thence N 87° 45' E 50 ft. to point of beginning.
 shall be changed from its present classification of R-2 Single-Family Residential Zone District to P-Parking.
 Section 2. The Zoning Map attached to Ordinance No. 527 shall be deemed modified to incorporate this change.
 Ordained by the Commission of the City of Birmingham this 6th day of November, 1961, to be effective upon publication.

Voting Precincts Await Nov. 20 School Election

Thirteen voting precincts will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Nov. 20 for Birmingham's special school election. Precincts and their boundaries are as follows:

Precinct No. 1—
 The area bounded on the north by Big Beaver Road, on the east by Adams Road and the G.T.W.R.R., on the south by Hazel Street (both sides) west of Adams Road and Villa Road (both sides) east of Adams Road and on the west by Woodward Avenue. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at Adams School for all school elections.

Precinct No. 2—
 The area bounded on the north by the district limits, on the east by North Woodward Avenue, Redding Road and the River Rouge, on the south by West Maple Avenue and on the west by Covington Road. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at Quarton School for all school elections.

Precinct No. 3—
 The area bounded on the north by Redding Road, on the east by Woodward Avenue, on the south by Lincaster Avenue and on the west by the River Rouge. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at Baldwin School for all school elections.

Precinct No. 4—
 The area bounded on the north by Lincoln Avenue, on the east by Woodward Avenue, on the south by 14 Mile Road and on the west by the River Rouge. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at Pierce School for all school elections.

Precinct No. 5—
 The area included in the former Franklin School District, being that part of the Birmingham School District bounded on the north by 14 Mile Road, on the east by the eastern boundary of the Village of Bingham Farms, on the south by the district limits and on the west by Inkster Road. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at the Franklin Village School for all school elections.

Precinct No. 6—
 The area bounded on the north by Quarton Road, on the east by Covington Road and South Cranbrook Road, on the south by 14 Mile Road and on the west by the district limits. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at the Bloomfield Village School for all school elections.

Precinct No. 7—
 The area included in the former Walnut Lake School District, being that part of

the Birmingham School District bounded on the north by the district limits, on the east by the district limits, on the south by 14 Mile Road and on the west by Middlebelt Road. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at the Walnut Lake School for all school elections.

Precinct No. 8—
 The area bounded on the north by West Maple Avenue, on the east by the River Rouge, on the south by the Birmingham Country Club and on the west by South Cranbrook Road. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at the Midvale School for all school elections.

Precinct No. 9—
 The area bounded on the north by Bowers Street (both sides) west of Adams Road, Hazel Street (both sides) east of Adams Road and Maple Road (east of the G.T.W.R.R.), on the east by the district limits, on the south by 14 Mile Road and on the west by Woodward Avenue. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at the Torrey School for all school elections.

Precinct No. 10—
 The area bounded on the north by Big Beaver Road, on the east by the district limits, on the south by East Maple Road and on the west by the G.T.W.R.R. and North Adams Road. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at the Pembroke School for all school elections.

Precinct No. 11—
 The area bounded on the north by 14 Mile Road, on the east by Pierce Street, Beverly Road (both sides west of Pierce) and Southfield Road, on the south by the district limits and on the west by the eastern boundary of the Village of Bingham Farms. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at the Beverly School for all school elections.

Precinct No. 12—
 The area bounded on the north by the district limits, on the east by the district limits, on the south by Big Beaver Road and on the west by North Woodward Avenue. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at the Harlan School for all school elections.

Precinct No. 13—
 The area bounded on the north by the Beverly district limits and 14 Mile Road, on the east by Greenfield Road, on the south by the district limits and on the west by the district limits, Southfield Road and Pierce Street. Registered voters residing within these boundaries will vote at the Greenfield School for all school elections.

Troy Rejects Newell Request For Rezoning

The Troy City Commission rejected Monday night a request from Frank Newell to rezone property west of Crooks Road midway between 15 (Maple) and 16 (Big Beaver) roads from multiple housing to industrial.
 Commissioners voted 5-2 against his request.
 Approval would have meant a break in a major pattern of the Troy master plan.
 Newell contended that property adjacent to his is zoned industrial.
 HIS PROPERTY is a landlocked site about 160 feet west of Crooks. Newell sought to develop an industrial subdivision of small parcels while devoting 25 per cent of the land to green belt and a roadway from Crooks.
 Commissioners rejected his plan because they felt it would break the city's residential area from its heavily industrialized area in the south.
 They argued that this would subject all multiple zoning to similar encroachment and would defeat one of the main purposes of the master plan.

 The returning speaker is Dr. Marvin Felheim, assistant professor of English at the University of Michigan. A social hour will follow his talk at the library auditorium.
 Felheim is a critic of the modern psychoanalytic novel and its "popular pattern of perversion and violence in a setting of high class people." His topic Monday will be contemporary drama.
 The meeting is open only to Friends of the Baldwin Public Library. Interested persons may obtain information about joining the Friends through a call or visit to the library.
