NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a special election will be held in the School District of the City of Birmingham, County of Oakland, and State of Michigan, on Monday, the 20th day of November, 1961, to vote upon the following propositions:

**A.** Shall the School District of the City of Birmingham, County of Oakland, State of Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Four Million Nine Hundred Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$4,915,000) and issue its bonds therefor, for the purpose of defraying the cost of erecting, furnishing and equipping a new Junior High School building, one new elementary school building, an additional service building, and additions to the Barnum Junior High School building and the Pembroke, Harlan, Franklin and Bloomfield Village Elementary School buildings, making other permanent improvements to school buildings and sites, and acquiring school sites and additions to school sites, all in said school district?

**B.** Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes which may be assessed each year against property in the School District of the City of Birmingham, County of Oakland, State of Michigan, for all purposes except taxes for the payment of interest and principal on obligations incurred prior to December 8, 1932, be increased as provided in Section 21 of Article X of the Constitution of Michigan, for a period of five (5) years from 1962 to 1966, both inclusive, by 11 mills on each dollar (\$11.00 per \$1,000) of the assessed valuation as equalized, for the purpose of defraying a part of the operating expenses of the school district (6 of said 11 mills being in the nature of an extension of the 6-mill increase voted in 1957 which expires in 1961)?

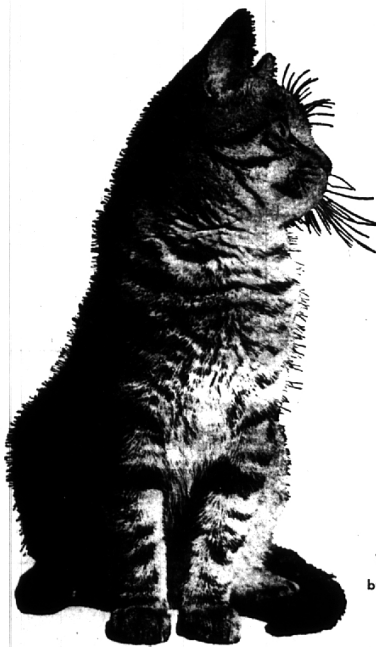
