Science Institute Co-Sponsors Talk

Dr. Willard Bascom, director of the National Research Council's "Mobile Project," will speak at a special public lecture at 8:15 p.m., Nov. 24 in Detroit's Rackham Auditorium, co-sponsored by Cranbrook Institute of Science.

Dr. Bascom, a member of the staff of the National Academy of Sciences since 1954 and United States delegate to the IGY (International Geophysical Year) Conference on Oceanography in Sweden in 1957, will discuss the structure of the earth and its crust, how deep holes are drilled in the ocean and the experimental drilling at Guadalupe Island. His talk will be illustrated with a color film.

Dr. Bascom is author of the book "A Hole in the Bottom of the Sea." The lecture is co-sponsored by the Society of Sigma Xi, national scientific society, Wayne State University chapter.

New Manual Outlines Governmental Powers

"The Powers of Local Government in Michigan," a manual for public officials, is being sent to over 500 city managers, mayors, township supervisors, and municipal attorneys in the six-county Detroit metropolitan area by the Southeastern Michigan Metropolitan Community Research Corporation.

According to Walter H. Blucher, the corporation's executive director, public officials are often unaware of the specific powers that are authorized by statute to the powers of local government.

This volume attempts to summarize the existing statutes and to translate the statutory language, which is frequently difficult to understand, into understandable language. It is primarily a reference work to make information on the powers of local government readily available to public officials who are not lawyers, but it is not a substitute for legal interpretation of the laws.

Resident Attends Leaders Seminar

Mrs. Irene Murphy of Birmingham attended a community leaders seminar on the United Nations and world affairs sponsored by the Foreign Policy Association—World Affairs Center, Friday, in New York City.

Mrs. Murphy is regent of the University of Michigan.

Led by staff officers of the United States Mission to the United Nations, the program included discussions of the role of the United States in the United Nations and in the economic and social aspects of foreign policy.

The meeting, one of a series of programs presented by the Foreign Policy Association—World Affairs Center was designed to enlist and greater participation in world affairs of leading U.S. citizens.

THE REPORT was prepared for the Corporation by Dean L. Berry, J. D., with the cooperation of the Legislative Research Center at the University of Michigan School of Law.

Counties, townships and charter townships, home rule and fourth class cities, and home rule and general law villages are the types of local governments examined. The report not only examines powers of each but also outlines statutory provisions for the types of government and financial limitations and sources of revenue that apply to the respective units.

Highlight of the study is a series of tabular references dealing with the property tax and bonded debt limitations, regulatory powers, and functional powers which apply to each unit of government. Of particular interest are the statutory provisions governing the power of units to provide services jointly with other units, to contract with other units, or to operate beyond their own boundaries — in other words, to cooperate in providing joint services.

Band Director Appointed to Music Board

Robert W. Kurscher, Seaholm High School band director, has been appointed a member of the National Advisory Board of music educators.

The board is composed of nearly 500 music educators and band directors from high schools and colleges across the nation, who will meet "by proxy" to consider common problems and to pool professional resources.

G. Leblanc Corp., Kenosha, Wis., a manufacturer of musical instruments, is sponsor of the group.

"We are very pleased to have so many distinguished educators join with us in helping to achieve our common goal of musical America," said Vito S. Pasucci, president of Leblanc.

Completed questionnaires will be screened at Leblanc and the ideas and information they contain condensed and made available to music educators everywhere for their consideration and use. A face-to-face meeting of the board is projected for some time in the future.
