4,000 Oakl'd Residents May Lose SS Benefits

An estimated 4,000 residents of Oakland County who are 65 or older and are still employed may lose some social security benefits if they do not file an application by Jan. 31, 1962, according to William E. LaRock, district manager of the Pontiac Social Security Office.

LaRock said that many of these people are under the impression that earnings of more than \$1,200 in 1961, would make them ineligible to receive benefits. However, recent amendments to the social-security law make it possible in some cases for a family to receive some benefits for the year even though the worker has annual earnings of as much as \$4,000.

All residents of Oakland County who are 65 or over, have worked under social security, and have not applied for benefits should apply before Jan. 31, 1962, LaRock said.

IT IS DIFFICULT to tell whether or not any benefits may be payable until the records have been assembled, but the filing of an application can never be harmful and in many cases may prevent the loss of benefits which could have been paid if an application had been filed.

The general rule applicable to persons under 72, who are still working, is that earnings of \$1,200 or less in a year will not prevent an eligible person from receiving social security benefits.

Earnings between \$1,200 and \$1,700 would result in the suspension of one dollar of benefits for every two dollars of earnings.

BENEFITS ARE stopped on a dollar-for-dollar basis for earnings over \$1,700 a year.

Regardless of the total earnings, an eligible person can receive benefits from social security for months in which he earns \$100 or less and does not work in a business of his own.

Any person now 65 or older would be eligible for benefits if he had worked under social security for about two and one-half years, LaRock said. Some would be eligible with as little as one and one-half years of employment.

ANY SOCIAL SECURITY benefits received are considered to be non-taxable for federal income tax purposes.

The Pontiac District Social Security office, which serves all of Oakland County is located in the Federal Building at 35 East Tison Street.

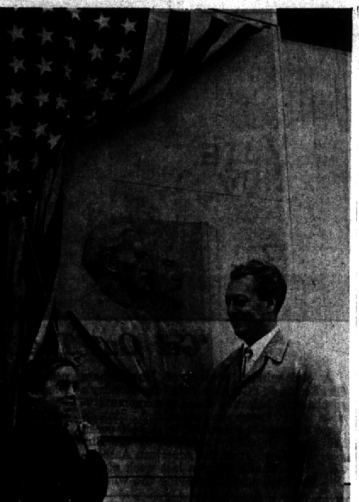
