MRS. FLORENCE Willett, Mayor of Birmingham, assisted Mr. Charles Gale, Birmingham Forestry Director, in the ceremony. Also present were Mrs. A. J. Mitchell, Jr., and Mrs. Wm. Shaughnessy, troop leaders.

The bulbs, according to Mr. Gale who arranged their purchase, are all guaranteed to be golden in keeping with the Golden Anniversary theme.

THE BULBS were paid for by the Girl Scouts with money coming from the proceeds of their annual calendar sale.

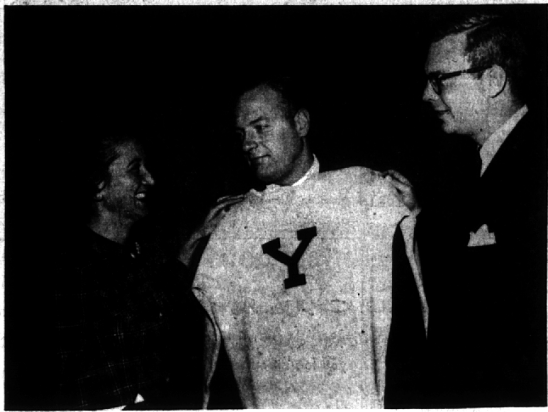
