Dr. Harry Alexis Harding, 580 Haverhill, Bloomfield Hills, died Thursday at Steven's Nursing Home in Royal Oak after a long illness. He was born Nov. 28, 1871 in Oconomowoc, Wis. Dr. Harding lived here since 1941.

He was director of the Matthews Co., setting in 1941. An educator and scientist, he taught at Cornell University and the University of Illinois, where he was head of the bacteriology department and specialized in dairy science.

HE GRADUATED from the University of Wisconsin and received his doctorate at Cornell University. Dr. Harding studied at Universities here and in Europe.

Dr. Harding was commissioner of Health at Experimental Station at Geneva, N. Y. and was instrumental in legislation for the purification of dairy products in many states.

He was a charter member of American Society of Bacteriology, charter member of American Public Health Association, American Dairy Science Association and Fellow of Royal Institute of Health of England. He was a mason over 60 years.

Surviving are his wife, Jessica; a son, Gordon; stepson, Trevor W. Hay; three daughters and a stepdaughter.

Services were Saturday from Bell Chapel of the William R. Hamilton Co., with interment in Oakview Cemetery.

Nov. 27 Hearing Slated In 12 Town Drain Suit

A hearing has been set for Nov. 27 for a suit that may block, temporarily, construction of the Twelve Town Drain.

Mole Construction Co., Escrow, and its president, Lou DeMarco, have filed a lawsuit to try to prevent the Greenfield Construction Co., Detroit, from being awarded a \$1.3 million contract for a section of the storm-relief drain in Farmington Hills.

They say the drain board erred in awarding the contract to Greenfield's because its bid did not conform with specifications.

The suit charges that Greenfield's bid did not include a manhole and that the board again erred in allowing the firm to submit a supplemental bid of \$2,000 to cover it.

MOLE CO. says that because Greenfield omitted costs for the manhole in its Sept. 26 bid, Mole should have been declared the low bidder and granted the contract.

Daniel W. Barry, county drain commissioner, said Greenfield's total bid was still \$17,254 lower than Mole's, however.

Mole Co. attorneys will ask Circuit Judge William J. Beer to set aside the contract to Greenfield and award it to Mole. Judge Beer has set a hearing for Nov. 27 and refused to issue a temporary restraining order asked by Mole.

DRAIN OFFICIALS sought to take bids Dec. 6 on bonds to finance the long-awaited drain. Construction is scheduled to start in February.

The drain has been held up for several years due to suits before the circuit and state supreme courts.

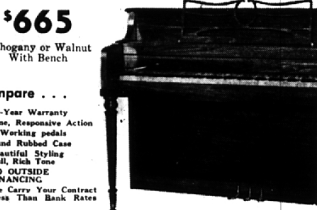
