Expenditures will include the establishment of a faculty salary increase fund, development of a program of African-Asian and Latin American studies, and expansion of buildings and facilities.

Mrs. John Carter of Birmingham, president of the local Goucher alumnae club, presided at the Saturday meeting.

IN HER report to Goucher alumnae, Mrs. Balling further stated that the recent Ford Foundation grant, one of eight made to liberal arts colleges in the country, will enable Goucher College to increase the number of yearly admissions and proceed with a plan for the expansion of the departments of humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences.
