Lathrup Studies Liquor Control, Zone Amendment

LATHRUP — Two ordinances were referred to City Attorney Everett Hayes for de-drafting at Monday's council meeting.

One, a liquor control ordinance, is aimed at assisting Lathrup police who must currently follow an involved procedure when they attempt to enforce the state law.

The proposed local ordinance would ban drinking in public places or supplying liquor to minors.

Ordinance 68 provides for a TP2 (transitional-professional) zoning amendment to the city's zoning ordinance 18.

INVOLVED IN part of a block east from Guy Place on 12 Mile Road. East of this area, zoned TP1, would be 100 feet of PG zone (parking greenbelt). Mayor Richard N. Cogger said.

Cogger said that TP2 zoning, which covers TP areas backing up to residential back yards, would differ from TP1 where the transitional area backs up to residential side yards.

As proposed, ordinance 68 spells out a one-story limit for publicly owned and operated state, federal, county and municipal office buildings, as well as for professional buildings.

Floor space and square footage are set; architecture and construction material must harmonize with
