**Board OK's Permit for John Stacy**

The Birmingham Board of Zoning Appeals Tuesday night approved issuance of a building permit to John P. Stacy, apparently bringing to an end a long battle between Stacy and city officials.

The most approved issuance of the permit on the basis of new plans submitted by Stacy for a house which he proposed to move into Birmingham (at Hillside and Lincoln) but which did not meet zoning requirements.

According to an agreement with residents of the Golf View Heights subdivision, Stacy must complete work on the house, adhering to the approved plans, within six months or remove it.

**CIRCUIT COURT** Judge William J. Beer dissolved restraining order against Stacy Wednesday morning that he had issued last week on the basis of complaints from the subdivision.

Judge Beer signed a consent decree stating that Stacy must complete his revised plans within the six-month period or remove the house.

For the past three months Stacy has sought to gain a permit from the City administration but refused until this week to appear before the appeals board.

After the time, he accused city officials of violating the zoning ordinance and at one point asked the state for a grand jury investigation, which resulted in a routine check.

The board of zoning appeals granted Stacy a variance of the zoning law inasmuch as his plans served as a compromise between both the City's and the subdivision's requirements.

**Physician Asks For Rezoning of Hazel-Elm Corner**

Seeking to build a doctor's clinic, a Bloomfield Hills physician has petitioned for rezoning of property at the northwest corner of Hazel and Elm in Birmingham from R-2 single family to B-1 non-retail business.

City commissioners Monday night referred to the plan board for recommendation a petition from Dr. John F. Wood, 664 Edgemoor.

"It is my intention," said Dr. Wood, "to utilize this property for the purpose of a doctor's clinic building. This should not detract but should add substantially to the appearance of the present site and also to the value of the surrounding property."

Commissioners recently rejected a petition for rezoning at Hazel and Adams in this same area, because they felt it would not be compatible to the residential character of the neighborhood.


