The second new draft board will be Local Board No. 331 and will have jurisdiction over registrants residing in the townships of Addison, Brandon, Groveland, Holly, Independence, Oakland, Orion, Oxford, Rose, Springfield and Waterford.

Dean L. Palmer To Present Program At Church of Christ

Dean L. Palmer, dean of Michigan Christian College in Rochester, will be featured Wednesday night at 7:30 at the Birmingham Church of Christ. Palmer will show colored slides of Jerusalem and the Holy Land which he took last summer while he was touring Palestine and other European and African countries.

Palmer was formerly president of Nashville Christian Institute in Nashville, Tenn., before holding that position. He was a missionary for the Churches of Christ for three years in Nigeria, Africa, and in charge of the Christian school system in Nigeria during that time. Last year, he toured Germany, Italy, Palestine and Nigeria. The pictures to be shown were filmed while he was on his trip.
