

College-Age Number To Surge in 15 Years

Michigan's college-age population will be 35 per cent larger in 1975 than in 1960, the Michigan Council of State College Presidents announced today.

M. M. Chambers, Council executive director, said the prediction was based upon a recent report entitled "College Enrollment Problem in Michigan, 1960-1975."

Author of the study is Dr. David Goldberg, program director of the Institute of Public Administration at the University of Michigan.

Quoting from the report, Dr. Chambers said "the present crop of college students is more than likely to double within 15 years and possibly triple within 20 years."

Obviously, the task faced by the legislature and the agencies developing the plans to meet an enrollment potential of 400,000 or 500,000 students fifteen years from now must represent an enormous undertaking.

DR. CHAMBERS said the report also states that as of 1960, the ratio of enrollment to population age 18-24 was slightly higher in Michigan than in the nation.

However, the state has characteristics which would lead us to expect a relatively high enrollment ratio. It is highly urbanized. Its adult population has an increasing educational level higher than the average for the United States.

Whether Michigan has reached an enrollment level that is appropriate is a question which is not answered by the report.

On long stretches of road, highway designers have to make corrections for curvature of the earth. SATELLITE surveying will help simplify this problem and the day may soon come when engineers will enter on a satellite photograph an order for a detailed picture of any part of Michigan on a few moments notice.

Most of today's new highways first came into existence as a line ruled across the face of one of these aerial portraits of the land below.
