Chairmanship of the Oakland County Republican Party changed hands last Thursday with a handshake between former chairman, Arthur G. Elliott, Jr. (right), of Pleasant Ridge, and new chairman, Charles L. Lytle, of 18890 Hillcrest, Beverly Hills. State legislators, Henry M. Hogan, Jr. (right), of the House, and Farrell Roberts, (left), of the Senate, were among the 13 voting members of the county executive committee which selected the 38-year-old Michigan sales representative of Electroloy Co. as GOP chairman. Elliott's resignation was based on his belief that "Oakland County's future growth can be enhanced by the fresh ideas that new leadership will bring."
