

Wood Creek Discusses CD, Road Program

WOOD CREEK FARMS—Wood Creek Farms moved smoothly over routine matters Tuesday, according to Councilman Arthur Busch's reports for procedure as recommended by the building restrictions committee; discussing Dutch Elm disease control; municipal responsibility in Civil Defense and reviewing the fall road program.

Building applicants will be issued a simple step-by-step permit schedule to follow as construction progresses. It stipulates the correct procedure for inspections and committee approvals in the village.

COUNCILMAN Mrs. Conrad Lam was appointed to prepare proposed Dutch Elm Disease ordinance for council study. The ordinance may include measures for the preservation of other shade trees, as presently controlled by deed restrictions.

President Norman Krieger urged the study of Civil Defense recommendations to determine village responsibility regarding fall-out.

"I feel it is our duty to learn all we can about fall-out," he said, "we should know all there is to know about the village's duty in Civil Defense."

Street commissioner Jack Richards reported that fall work would begin as soon as the road grader, already contracted for, was salvaged from a cemetery. Richards explained the grader had a flat tire and was expected to be operating again this weekend.

RICHARDS ALSO advised the council that residents were free to borrow the recently purchased "sewer stick" to clean out private culverts. The sweep, with 50 feet of connecting rod, is stored in Richards' garage, and is available in the "do-it-yourself" — help-the-village — culvert cleaning program.

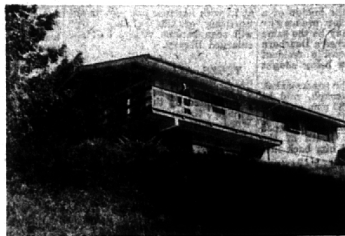
