John Mauff Visits County Family Service

John Mauff, field consultant for the Family Service Association of America, was a guest at the Family Service of Oakland County board meeting on Sept. 29. Mauff discussed his observations of the program and work by this agency with the board of directors, according to James C. Allen, president. National developments which will affect and benefit the local program were also discussed.

The county agency will be considered in the Ford Foundation grant of \$300,000. It will be given over a four-year period to the national association in order to help develop service programs to the aging in local communities. The agency will develop plans to improve its counseling services to families where there is concern over an aged person.

In addition, the association is celebrating its 50th anniversary at the biennial meeting in New York City in November. The local agencies will participate in this conference.

THE FAMILY SERVICE movement in Oakland County originated in 1926 when the South Oakland center was established; in 1950, this agency merged with the centers of Birmingham, Bloomfield and Pontiac Area and the current Family Service of Oakland County was incorporated.

Under the direction of Mrs. John McVay, the casework policy committee, in conjunction with the staff, has discussed and approved new approaches in family-centered casework such as seeing the total family together in interviews. The agency is also planning to start a group counseling program.

Application Forms For U of M Grants At High Schools

Michigan's 682 accredited high schools have just received freshman scholarship application forms from The University of Michigan, according to Assistant Dean of Men Ivan W. Parker.

Applications must be submitted by Dec. 20. Award winners will be announced in April. Selection is based upon high school records and recommendations, scores on the College Board Scholastic Aptitude Test (to be taken in December, 1961 or January, 1962), financial need and recommendations of alumni groups.

ALL ACCREDITED schools are entitled to at least one Regent-Alumni Scholarship of \$50 to \$60 if a qualified graduate applies. Last year 686 students won these awards.

Other freshman scholarships include awards granted by Consumers Power Company, General Motors Corporation, Society for Naval Architects and Marine Engineers, and Detroit Edison Company.

TWO SCHOLARSHIPS require special applications. They are the LaVerne Noyes and Horace H. Rackham undergraduate scholarships.

Each semester, 10 to 15 Noyes awards are granted to direct blood descendants of World War I veterans. Applications are due Feb. 15, 1962 for the spring semester and Aug. 1, 1962 for the fall.

TWO OR THREE \$500 Rackham scholarships are granted yearly, renewable up to eight semesters. Applications fall due on the March 15 of the school year preceding that for which the scholarship is desired.


If new scholarship programs are established that permit selection of winners for 1961-62, they will be chosen from students who filed the general application form, Dean Parker said.

Man on Scaffolding Injured as Broken Blade Strikes Him

Theodore Olson, 33, of Detroit, suffered a compound fractured leg and face Oct. 3 in Birmingham when the blade of a power grinder broke.

Olson was one of six men working from a scaffolding at the First Baptist Church of Birmingham. While cutting away the mortar between limestone blocks of the church building, the blade of Olson's power grinder broke, striking him in the leg and face.

Olson was taken to Beaumont Hospital by Birmingham Ambulance.
