

St. James Organ Series Features Noted Artists

St. James Episcopal Church will conduct a series of subscription musical programs beginning Oct. 23.

Including four organ concerts by outstanding artists and a choir-orchestra performance, the series will be held at the church, 555 W. Maple, Birmingham.

A UNIQUE FEATURE of the organ is that the console can be moved into the chancel area, enabling the audience to see the artist.
