

# Newell Property Zoning Change Draws Approval

An amendment to the 1954 court decree zoning the so-called Frank Newell property on Birmingham's east side won unanimous approval of Birmingham city commissioners Monday night.

The triangular piece of property, located between Eton Road and the Grand Trunk Western Railroad, was zoned Business A by circuit court in 1954.

Since then, the northern portion has been developed into multiple dwelling usage.

COMMISSIONERS Monday night approved an amended decree by Circuit Judge Stanton G. Dondero. It carried four zoning classifications.

R-5 zoning was adopted for the developed portion. The southern portion has an R-6 zoning, with a height restriction of two stories.

The remaining two parcels are now zoned B-2 and R-7, with a two-story height limitation on the latter.

Pembroke Manor Association, which was involved with the City in the original court case, approved the changes.
