Hill, vice president and general manager of Ford Motor Co's Tractor and Implement Division in Birmingham, was appointed by Walker L. Claser, drive chairman, at a special luncheon Oct. 4.

The Challenge Fund, said Claser, has the immediate objective of raising 10 million dollars to be collected over a three to five-year period.

It is the first phase of the University's recently announced long-range 25 million dollar development program.

Child Guidance Clinic Names Kelly Director

Dr. William J. Westmaas, 364 Rookwood, Birmingham, president of Oakland Child Guidance Clinics Inc., recently announced the appointment of Dr. William H. Kelly as acting medical director of the clinic.

Dr. Kelly, who was selected by the executive board of the clinic, will continue to serve as head of the Community Services Division of the Michigan Department of Health.

We are taking this action to improve the coordination between the three child guidance clinics in Oakland County and to strengthen the organization and operation of them," Dr. Westmaas said.

"THE INTERIM appointment of Dr. Kelly is indicative of the importance being placed on the work of the Child Guidance Clinics in Oakland County. We are engaged in a search for a full-time psychiatric director, and Dr. Kelly's assistance in directing the Clinic's overall activities will be invaluable while this search for a permanent director continues.

"The professional staffs of the clinics at Royal Oak, Birmingham and Pontiac have earned outstanding recognition throughout the state for Oakland County's child guidance work," said Dr. Westmaas.

Robert F. Wollaseger, who was appointed administrative director of the Clinics in 1960, continues in this capacity, making his headquarters at the Pontiac Clinic. Dr. Lillian D. Imperi is director of the Royal Oak Clinic, and H. W. McEachern is supervisor of the Birmingham branch clinic.

THE NEW ACTING director of the clinics has been assistant director of the Michigan Department of Mental Health and head of the division of Mental Hygiene since 1956.

Dr. Kelly obtained his early pre-medical and medical education at Marquette University in Milwaukee, Wis. His graduate training was at Pontiac State Hospital. He was awarded a fellowship in child psychiatry with the National Committee for Mental Hygiene,

Children's Center, Detroit, where he served from 1937 to 1938. His master of science degree in neurology and psychiatry was bestowed by Wayne State University School of Medicine, Detroit.

Dr. Kelly served as director of the Lansing Children's Center from 1939 to 1942 at which time he entered military service as a combat neuropsychiatrist.

LEAVING military service in 1946, he became director of the Norfolk, Va., Mental Hygiene Center, and in 1949 was named director of the Memorial Guidance Clinic at Richmond, Va. During the period 1952 until 1958, he served also as director of the Memorial Foundation and on the faculty of the Medical College of Virginia as assistant professor of pediatrics and neuropsychiatry.
