 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3.3 OF ORDINANCE NO. 527 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM AND THE ZONING MAP, BY ADDITION OF A SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 3.3-21.

THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM ORDAINS:
 Section 1. That Section 3.3 of Article 3 of Ordinance No. 527 be amended by addition of a section to be known as Section 3.3-21, said Section to read as follows:

**Road Plan Surplus
 Anticipated in Franklin**

FRANKLIN — The prospect of reducing millage and shortening the five-year road construction program seems likely for Franklin taxpayers.

Franklin's council indicated Monday night that work on roads was progressing so well it appears the five-year program can be accomplished easily in four. Councilman Eugene Kelly and Road Commissioner Norman Naimark stated that there was approximately \$16,000 of this year's funds which will not be expended.

In its third year, the program has moved along ahead of schedule with about \$20,000 of "extras" being completed this fall. Of the \$58,800 budgeted this year for the master maintenance plan, only about \$38,000 was contracted.

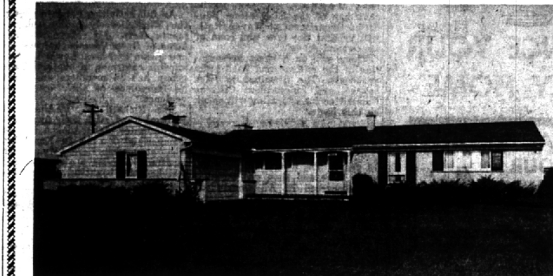
SOME FEELING exists about continuing the full eight-mill assessment for the balance of the time, accruing funds for future use.

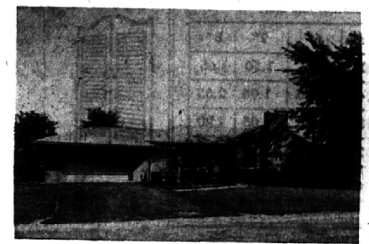
