anticipation but the record is not encouraging.

A few examples:

10/21/52—Russia demanded the U. N. investigate charges (made by Russia) that the U.S. had used germ warfare in Korea. The entire free world voted against this absurd charge. All but India. India abstained.

11/27/53—Again Russia demanded an investigation of the charge of germ warfare against the U.S. Again the resolution was overwhelmingly defeated—but this time India voted for the resolution.

12/3/53—The General Assembly voted to condemn Red China for holding U.S. prisoners in China in violation of the truce. India abstained.

11/29/56—The U.N. Assembly voted to condemn the Soviet Union for their brutal action in Hungary. The entire free world supported this resolution. India was the

only nation outside the Soviet bloc to vote against it. On the same day Nehru blithely stated that the action in Hungary was a civil disturbance.

THESE ARE just a few highlights. Let us hope that the speaker will discuss the questions and perhaps explain his government's stand on the matters above.

You will note on the votes above in which truth is difficult to discover. They are clear-cut matters of right and wrong, matters in which conscience and the facts can lead one to only one stand.

We can only hope that U.N. Day will turn out to be a vigorous and honest intellectual discussion of the great issues that face our nation today and not a platiitudinous "tear-party" during which the audience is force-fed propaganda by representatives of a professional lobbying group (the A.A.N.N.) and by the representative of a neutral state that cannot tell of anything from wrong.
