Orange Crate Theatre Starts Show Rolling

This year, as in several years past, the third graders of the Birmingham School District will again be treated, during the last week in October and the first week in November, to a "show" about the United Nations at the "Orange Crate Theater."

When the United Nations was founded more than a dozen years ago, the League of Women Voters of Birmingham wanted to acquaint the people of this city with the ideals and organization of the U.N.

AS A MEMBER of LWV, Mrs. Eleanor Gatill noted that the elementary school children had been overlooked in these efforts. And so it was that the idea of the orange crate theater evolved.

The original theater was made out of an orange crate with white curtains arranged at the front. These parted to reveal a continuous roll of some 15 hand-painted pictures illustrating the history and some of the functions of the U.N. Two handles at the top of the stage served to wind the roll back and forth.

This first theater has been supplemented by additional orange crates. "But the older it gets, the more the children love it," reports Mrs. Gatill.

THE "SHOW" is kept up to date with the addition or deletion of pictures from time to time. And several women of the area have donated their time to taking the "theater" around to the 14 elementary schools in the Birmingham system.

This year Mrs. Francis Henderson, Mrs. Richard MacAdams, Mrs. Gary King and Mrs. Cathy Jackson will be manning the orange crates! These visits are approved by the Board of Education.

"IT IS surprising the knowledge of and interest in current affairs that these youngsters have," says Mrs. Gatill. "It was felt that this interest began on about the third grade level and for this reason that grade was selected for these showings."

The entire presentation is summed up in a gratitude picture—what can we do for the U.N.? The instructor points out that practical ways are to send CARE packages, write to friends abroad, and tell parents about the U.N.

The couple will make their home in Madison Heights.

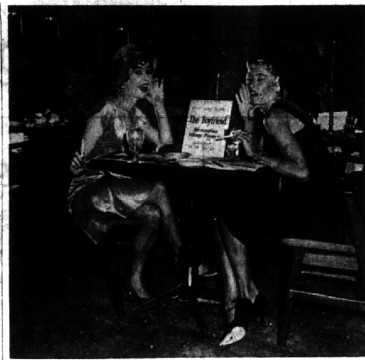
