Cbrook Students To Open UN Week

Foreign students from the Cranbrook Academy of Art will join students, interns and student nurses. The event will be held from 4 to 10 p.m. at 111 E. Kirby in Detroit. Refreshments will be served from 4 to 6 p.m. followed by a formal program in the Hall of Nations, during which Dr. James M. Davis, director of the International Center, University of Michigan, will address the group.

Also speaking on the program will be Councilman Del A. Smith, representing the City of Detroit; Arman Kitapci, chairman, International Institute's Support Club, representing the sponsoring organizations; and Harrison Mujica, president, International Student Society, representing the foreign students.

THE DRIVE WAS launched Tuesday with a luncheon for 500 volunteers in the Statler-Hilton Hotel, followed by the torch-lighting ceremonies at the foot of Woodward in Detroit.

A half-hour variety show in the Ford Auditorium, featuring ABC network comedian Johnny Carson, singing star Margaret Whiting, radio and television star Smiling Jack Smith and Liberace, preceded the torch lighting.

THE TORCH will blaze through Nov. 9. Meanwhile, 35,000 women volunteers are calling on homes and small businesses in Macomb and Kent counties and most of Oakland County, and 65,000 employees in offices and factories are discussing contributions with fellow workers.

A WEEK AFTER the drive starts, on Oct. 24, daily report luncheons will be held. Each will be sponsored by a Detroit-area corporation as a contribution plus to the success of the campaign. Reports will be made at these luncheons by the seven fund-raising units of the Torch Drive.

Wilson's Will Names Trusts

Two trusts are specified in the will left by Charles E. Wilson of Bloomfield Township, former president of General Motors Corp. and former secretary of defense. The will, providing one trust for Wilson's widow and another for his three sons, three daughters and grandchildren, was filed last Thursday in Oakland County Probate Court.

The will is expected to be admitted to probate Nov. 6. The exact value of the estate was not revealed but the will lists real estate in excess of \$25,000 and personal property in excess of \$50,000.

WILSON ALSO left a \$150,000 promissory note made by the Overseas Shipping Corp. to all six children and his interest in the Canterbury Financing Corp. for the trusts are Wilson's oldest son, Thomas E., and the National Bank of Detroit.

AF Launches New Reserve Program

New opportunities for important assignments in the Air Force Reserve program are available for members of the Birmingham area with prior military service. It was announced today by Lt. Col. John L. Underwood, commander of the 9613th Air Reserve squadron. The squadron, which has headquarters in Pontiac, contains 65 reserve officers and airmen from 20 Oakland County communities.

Col. Underwood said many assignments are available in a new reserve program of the Continental Air Command called "Air Recovery." Its objective will be to organize alternate airfields for U.S. aircraft in case primary air bases are destroyed by enemy attack. The greatest demand is for airmen with prior service in specialized skills such as administrative specialist, air police, ground radio operator, communications center specialist and many more. If qualified, airmen will secure pay for each training period as well as points toward promotion and retirement, said Col. Underwood.
