## Troy School Shelters Await Board Decision

Troy School Board Tuesday night is expected to decide on a request for an underground fallout shelter near the Colerain School.

The request was presented to the board Oct. 10 by Civil Defense Director Clarence Long, but members wanted to think about it until their next meeting.

Designed to accommodate 170 persons for 60 days, the proposed shelter would be located 60 feet from the school and used by school children and teachers in case of a nuclear attack. It would be equipped with a 20-gallon supply of water and enough food for 60 days.

According to Long, construction of the shelter would cost \$37,000.

Some board members wonder if protection of the children is the school's responsibility while others think parents would rather have their children home in the event of an attack.

However, Long insists "You have to start this program somewhere. Once it gets going I think it will snowball," he said.

**LONG'S PLAN FOR** building the shelter calls for community donations and community labor. Once the shelter at Colerain is built, said Long, bids would be sought for shelters at other schools.

Estimated cost of the shelter per child would be about \$175. At that figure, said Sgt. Rex E. Smith, shelters for every school would cost about \$660,000.

**CITY OF BIRMINGHAM ORDINANCE NO. 573**

**AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3.3 OF ORDINANCE NO. 527 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM AND THE ZONING MAP, BY ADDITION OF A SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 3.3-22.

THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 3.3 of Ordinance No. 527 be amended by addition of a section to be known as Section 3.3-22, said Section to read as follows:

Section 3.3-22. Property described as follows:

The N.120 feet of Lots 3 and 4, Block 2 of Herbert A. Poppleton's Addition, known as 181 Poppleton Street and 120 Knox Street; also a portion of Lot 2 of Assessor's Plat 26 described as follows:

Commencing at the S.W. corner of Poppleton and Knox streets West along the South line of Knox Street 120 feet to the point of beginning;

thence N. 2 degrees, 04 minutes, 30 seconds West 50 feet;

thence South 87 degrees, 54 minutes, 50 seconds West 50.0 feet;

thence North 2 degrees, 04 minutes, 30 seconds West 119.19 feet;

thence South 87 degrees, 45 minutes, 00 seconds West 129.18 feet;

thence South 2 degrees, 12 minutes, 40 seconds East 170 feet;

thence Easterly to the point of beginning

shall be changed from its present classification of R-2 Single-Family Residential Zone District to P-Parking.

Section 2. The Zoning Map attached to Ordinance No. 527 shall be deemed modified to incorporate this change.

Ordained by the Commission of the City of Birmingham this 9th day of October, 1961, to be effective upon publication.
