

Southfield Mailman Dies After Accident On 12 Mile Road

SOUTHFIELD—Dennis W. Riutta, 23-year-old Southfield mailman, died Oct. 18 at William Beaumont Hospital of head injuries suffered the night before in a two-car crash on 12 Mile Road.

Riutta's convertible was struck broadside by a car driven by Everett Majors, 27, of Muskegon, Okla. Major suffered a fractured jaw, a cut right ankle and multiple bruises. He was released from Beaumont Hospital on Oct. 19.

Beverly Councilmen, Library Officials To Meet Tonight

They will view proposed alternatives for future library service to non-Birmingham residents. It will include the possibility of a library-community contract where the total amount would be paid by a general tax, in participating community.

Abortion Caused Woman's Death, Inquest Jury Says

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP — A coroner's inquest jury has ruled that an illegal abortive operation performed by Dr. Bernard W. Weiss, 43, of 1135 Charrington, resulted in the Sept. 22 death of a Madison Heights woman.

Dr. Weiss signed the woman's death certificate which listed the cause as a coronary thrombosis. The inquest was held Oct. 16 before West Bloomfield Township Justice Elmer C. Dietrich. A jury of three men and three women returned the verdict.

Dr. Richard E. Olson, pathologist at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, Pontiac, testified that the death of the woman, Mrs. Dorothy Engle, was caused by the operation. Dr. Olson said there was no evidence of a coronary.

Mrs. Engle's body was exhumed Oct. 3 from the White Chapel Memorial Cemetery, Troy on an order from the Oakland County Prosecutor's office.

The warrant for the arrest of Dr. Weiss and the two others was issued by the Wayne County Prosecutor's office.

THE WARRANT charges the three look part in an illegal operation Sept. 22 at Dr. Weiss' Livonia office resulting in the death of Mrs. Engle.




