In B'field Township**

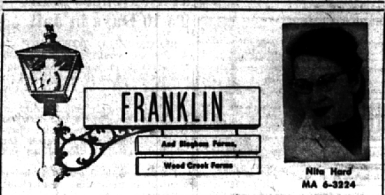
BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP — A Detroit man was sentenced Tuesday to 90 days in jail on charges of drunk and disorderly conduct on a public highway.

Douglas Warren pleaded not guilty at his arraignment Oct. 17 before Justice of the Peace Alice Gilbert. Bond was set at \$500 pending trial Tuesday of this week.

Warren was placed on probation for one year and given a 90-day suspended sentence by West Bloomfield Township Justice of the Peace Elmer C. Dietrich, in June of this year, for the same offense.

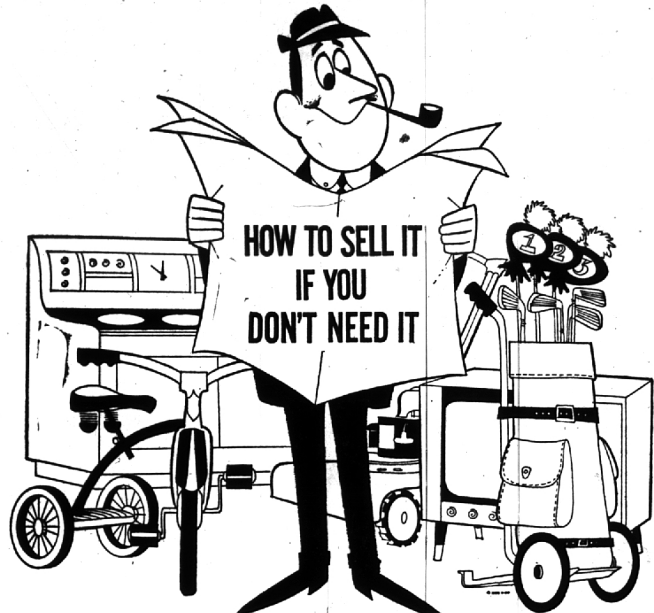
