## Local Minister to Head Industrial Study Project

Upon request of the Presiding Bishop in New York, the Rev. C. Gillette, vicar of the Episcopal Church in Birmingham, was granted a three-and-one-half-month leave of absence by his bishop to assume directorship of the Industrial Study Project. The project is a special study to be prepared for the national convention of the Episcopal Church to be held in Detroit's Cobo Hall, Sept. 29-30.

The Rev. Gillette established national headquarters for the project at Christ Church Cranbrook. During the past summer he has traveled across the country from Boston to Los Angeles, carrying the ideas of leading clergy and laymen.

**FROM HIS OFFICE** he has come plans for a joint session of the convention to be proposed by the Joint Commission on the Church in Human Affairs.

The purpose of the Industrial Study Project is to prepare a presentation that will dramatically demonstrate the changes industrialization has wrought on the lives of people and the significance of those changes to the church.

## Break Ground For AAA Office In Lathrup

**LATHRUP** — The Automobile Club of Michigan broke ground Wednesday morning for a divisional office building, Theodore Battista of Oak Park will head the new division.

Richard Cogger and City Administrator Jerald Stone joined club officials in a brief ground-breaking ceremony to start construction on the \$150,000 one-story office building. Theodore Battista of Oak Park will head the new division.

The office will serve as local headquarters for between 12,000 and 15,000 AAA members in the South Oakland area. The new division's territory will include all of the cities of Southfield and Lathrup and portions of Oak Park, Berkeley and Huntington Woods.

**DETROIT** Automobile Inter-Insurance Exchange operations in this area will also be centered here, said M. N. Malone, of the Exchange's Detroit office.

The building, which will face west on Southfield, will be of contemporary architecture and provide a total of 11,000 square feet of floor space. Its facade will be composed mainly of broad expanses of glass and cut stone supplemented by a concrete and aluminum canopy. Paved parking areas to the rear and one side will provide space for 50 cars.

Completion date for the new office is set for early 1962.

One hot issue in recent weeks has centered around labor endorsement, with Republicans charging that Democratic candidates are labor-contract and Democrats countering that Republicans aren't worthy of labor support.

## '62 County Budget Includes \$32,500 For Child Clinic

Oakland Child Guidance Clinic is assured of at least \$32,500 in the '62 county budget approved this week by the Ways and Means Committee of the Oakland County Board of Supervisors.

The clinic's appropriation is an interim contribution pending completion of a report by a special study committee.

The Ways and Means unit is expected to recommend that part of the county contingent fund be re-allocated in event a higher appropriation for the clinic becomes available.

TOTALING \$14,845,586, the county budget will be presented to the full board of supervisors Monday. The tax rate will be \$5.25 per \$100 of equalized valuation. The 1962 budget is \$120,000 higher than the one for 1961.

Included in the new one is \$10,000,000 in property taxes. Increases in miscellaneous revenues are expected to provide the balance.
