Scalding Lobsters Cruel—Unnecessary



Q. Perhaps this is an improper question, but in a way it is medical. Is there a way to kill lobsters and crabs without scalding them to death? This must be very painful.

A. Yes. Put the lobster or crab in lukewarm fresh water. Most sea creatures of this type (Crustaceans) can withstand very little heat and when subjected to this treatment, die quickly and easily without showing distress. As soon as the creature is dead, the water can be quickly brought to boiling. The meat is just as good as that obtained by the scalding treatment.

Q. Would it be harmful (or perhaps it might be helpful) for a person with high blood pressure to donate blood? Wouldn't blood-letting reduce blood pressure?

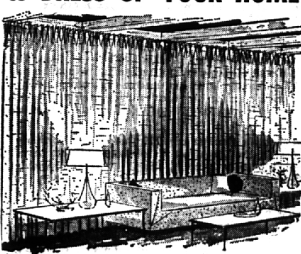
A. Blood-letting for high blood pressure is of no value in the ordinary course of the disease and went out with the horse and buggy. A blood donor center is no place for an unhealthy person.

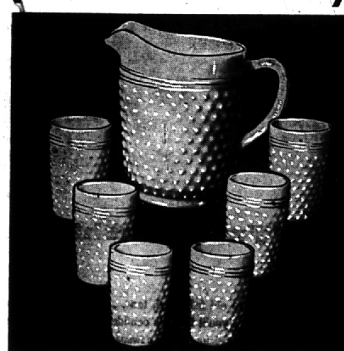
