Northbrook Construction Under Way

Construction of Northbrook Presbyterian Church's new \$200,000 building at 12 Mile near Laker is well under way with this week's completion of the foundation. This first unit, which will provide a fellowship hall, kitchen and wing of classrooms, is expected to be ready in February. The church's seven acres of land eventually will be occupied by two other units including an additional wing of classrooms, church offices and a sanctuary. A former mission extension of Woodward Avenue Presbyterian Church of Detroit, Northbrook organized as a separate church last October. The congregation meets in Northbrook Elementary School at 12 Mile near Southfield.
