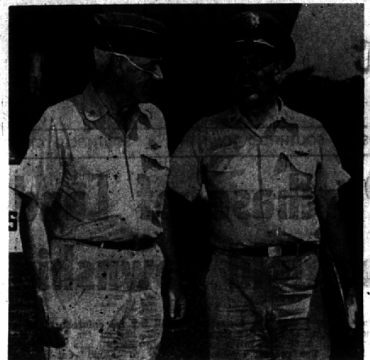
Mrs. Kelley alleged that she would be paying taxes to retire a bond issue for storm sewers that would not service land owned by her. The land is not yet fully developed.

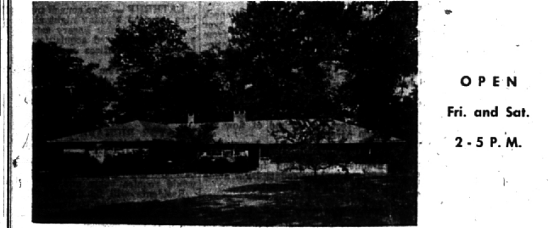

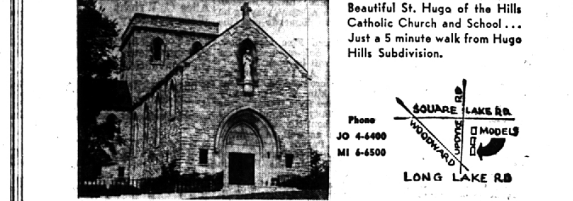

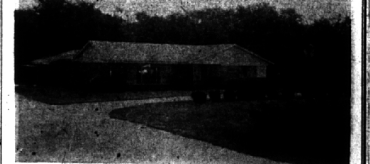
