Troy Water Problems Get Commission Action

Water problems in two sections of Troy reached solution last week following action by city commissioners.
Installation of a 12-inch water main along E. Long Lake Road to a depth of six feet was approved. The city will pay for the purchase of the Axtell-Maple water mains and pumping equipment in the south-west corner of Troy. The purchase will be made from Clawson at a cost of \$10,000.
The city will share the Troy water department and by benefiting property owners. A special assessment at a rate of \$3.50 per front foot will be charged for property owners along E. Long Lake Road.

THE ASSESSMENT is higher than that paid by those who are assessed for six inch lines but officials said the property along Long Lake Road will receive greater benefits from the larger lines.
Petitioners in the past usually paid the full cost of six-inch mains. Cost of the 12 inch line is approximately the same amount as the property will share about \$4,000. The city will share the cost because the line will serve as a major east-west feeder main in the city and will eventually connect to the local water line through which Troy will receive water from the local water utility.
City Manager David E. Firestone said nothing smaller than a 12-inch main could be used for the purpose. Property owners cannot afford cost of the 12 inch main on special assessment, some of the commissioners said.

MSU Offers 60 Courses

Michigan State University Oakland's department of continuing education will offer 60 courses, including 22 new subjects during the fall term beginning Sept. 25. "More than half of the courses are in the humanities, social science, fine arts and languages," Dr. Lowell Eshen Associates Dean of the University for Continuing Education, announced.
"We are proud of being able to offer this broadening education to adults as well as our high-level professional development courses."
TEACHERS of new professional courses are being drawn from the community.
Some of the new courses include Selling and Communication, Introduction to Digital Computer, Programming, Product Analysis, Applied Statistics, Business Administration, Public Relations, Theory and use of the Slide Rule, Business English, Report Writing and Human Engineering and Management in Development.
Among new courses offered in the liberal arts will be The Psychology of Child Development, The Psychology of Family Relations, History and Appreciation of Art, Introduction to Opera, Sculpture and Introductory Water Color Painting.

BECAUSE OF THE general demand, Seminars on American Values and Goals will be repeated this term.
Four other new subjects are Understanding World Affairs, The Dynamics of American Government, Western Institutions and Social Ideas Since 1700, and Beginning Choral Conducting.

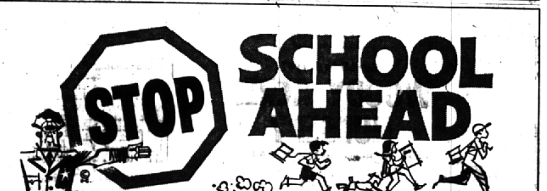
