**Local Officials Participate In County Courthouse Rites**

Oakland County has a fully dedicated \$5.5 million courthouse today. Some 500 persons, including many Birmingham-Bloomfield area dignitaries, attended the dedication ceremonies in Pontiac in 87-degree heat Saturday. Birmingham Supervisor David Levinson, chairman of the County Board of Supervisors' Ways and Means Committee, presided over the ceremony. He dedicated the building as "the happy culmination of our efforts" started 16 years ago. Levinson and his wife unveiled a 4-by-6-foot white bronze dedication plaque in the lobby of the new courthouse. There were 154 names on it of supervisors who had served or are serving on the board during the period of decision and construction. Levinson and other Birmingham supervisors, Luther Heamington, chairman of the County Board of Supervisors, and other supervisors broke ground Saturday for a \$1.4 million west administrative wing to the tower. Heacock is chairman of the Building and Grounds Committee. Michigan Supreme Court Justice John R. Dehmer called the new building "one of the finest in the state and country." Among those from this area attending the rites were State Representative Henry Hogan, a Bloomfield Township trustee; H. Russell Holland, Circuit Court judge; the Rev. Dr. W. Glen Harris, pastor of First Presbyterian Church, Birmingham, who delivered the invocation.

**City Commission Amends 701 Program Application**

Birmingham's application for the 701 Urban Planning Assistance Program is being amended to include the purchase of aerial photographs and contour maps of the city, thereby saving about \$6,300 in planning costs. City commissioners decided Monday night to incorporate a reduced cost of \$1,400 for aerial photographs and \$7,000 for contour maps into the City's application. The City was recently advised by the Building Division of the Department of Administration in Lansing that it is entitled to inclusion of these costs under the 701 Program. At this rate the City will save 75 per cent or \$6,300 of the combined \$8,400 cost for aerial photographs and contour maps, estimated at a cost of \$8,400, would cost the City \$2,100. City Manager L. R. Gare, who recommended the amendment to Birmingham's application, told commissioners, "We have always wanted aerial maps, but because of the cost, we have hesitated in asking the commission for them."

CARE EMPHASIZED that contour maps would be very valuable to the City in its study of relief sewers and flood plain control. Once contour maps are obtained, said Gare, they would not have to be acquired again. Although Birmingham's 701 Program application is filed in Lansing, enough time remains for the City to amend it before submission to the Federal Government. With the addition of the costs of the contour maps and aerial photographs, the overall contribution to the 701 Program would amount to \$5,135.50 in cash, plus \$2,264.50 in the form of a grant under the \$10,200 set aside in the 1961-62 budget for the 701 program.

BIRMINGHAM'S actual contribution of \$8,077.50 would represent about one-fourth of the total estimated cost of \$32,000 for the overall planning work. The remainder would be financed by the Federal Government.
