Telegraph-Maple Accident Rate Shows Decrease

The State Highway Department said today accidents have been reduced 53 per cent and injuries 74 per cent at the intersection of U.S. 24 and 15-Mile Road (Telegraph and Maple) in Bloomfield Township.

The Highway Department said the accident decrease occurred after a protected lane was built for motorists turning left from Telegraph onto Maple.

The Highway Department studies showed accidents dropped from 57 during the year before the improvements to 27 the following year and injuries dropped from 42 to 11.

There was a nine per cent increase in traffic at the intersection during the same period.

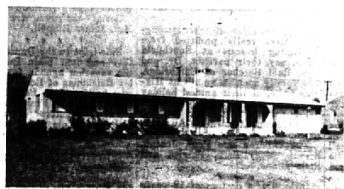

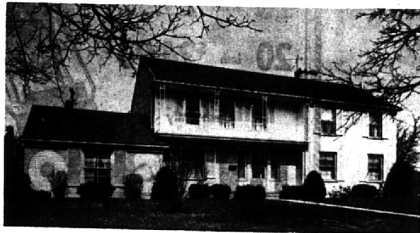

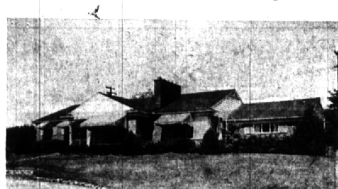
