Plans Under Way for New Church

BEVERLY HILLS—Officials of the Beverly Hills Methodist Church convened last week to sign an architectural contract for the design of a \$125,000 church structure on a seven-acre parcel of land on the northeast corner of Evergreen and 13 Mile Road. Additional units are planned for future years to total an estimated \$500,000 project. According to the building committee representatives, plans for the first unit should be ready for approval in October. A building fund campaign is slated for November. It is hoped that the working plans will be finalized early

next year so that contracts can be let and construction started in early spring.
