City commissioners Sept. 11 approved the distribution of \$8.00 fund was requested by the Twelve Towns Drainage Board. Upon the sale of Twelve Towns bonds, the drainage board will be issuing refund checks to the various municipalities which advanced funds to meet preliminary expenses of Twelve Towns Relief Drains.

The \$2,582 represents the total fund advance made by the Township of Troy in 1954 and 1955 prior to the incorporation of the City of Troy. Although Troy City incorporation and subsequent annexation covered practically all of Troy Township, a small area was annexed by Birmingham which entitles Birmingham to the \$8.00 refund.

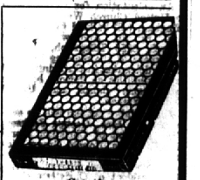
