

Ford Accepting Applications For Scholarships

The Ford Motor Company Fund announced this week that applications will be accepted until Dec. 1 for approximately 70 scholarships to be awarded in 1962 to children of Ford employees.

To be eligible, an applicant must be graduated from high school between Sept. 1, 1961, and Aug. 31, 1962, and be in the upper one-third of his class scholastically.

Sons and daughters of Ford employees, including stepchildren and children of deceased or retired employees, are eligible to apply.

THE COLLEGE Entrance Examination Board's scholastic aptitude tests will be given to applicants on Jan. 13, 1962, in major cities throughout the nation.

Winners will be determined on the basis of their test scores, class standing, recommendations of their high school principals and other potentialities for success in college and post-college life. Names

of winners will be announced in the spring of 1962.

ABOUT 70 scholarships have been awarded each year since the program was begun in 1951. In the current school term, 263 winners from 24 states are enrolled at 92 colleges and universities.

In the spring of 1961, scholarships were granted to 70 students who entered the competition. Winners may attend any approved college or university in the United States. The scholarship covers the student's tuition and academic fees and 80 per cent of his normal living costs, up to maximums of \$750 a year for students living away from home or \$300 a year for those living at home.

PRIVATE ENDOWED schools also receive from the Ford Motor Company Fund annual cost-of-education grants of \$500 for each scholarship winner enrolled.

Enrollment at City and Country School of Bloomfield Hills was reported at 287 children on the opening day of school. Of these pupils, 71 are in the nursery, 30 in the kindergarten and 186 in the grades. Eight new staff members have been added.

During the summer a new office for the secretarial staff and a brand new nursery addition were completed.

Work on a new building will be completed by Oct. 1. The new addition will consist of two new classrooms, two workrooms, a science room equipped to high school standards, a biology room and a science storage room.

Kindergarten and higher grades admit only gifted children.

5 Area Physicians Will Attend Confab

Five Birmingham area physicians will be among representatives of the medical profession who will act upon a wide range of subjects related to the state's health and welfare when the Michigan State Medical Society House of Delegates convenes Sept. 24-26 in Grand Rapids.

Delegates will include doctors W. J. Zimmerman, R. M. Bookmyer, H. E. L. Schwartz and E. J. Mueller of Birmingham and Dr. J. R. Quinn of Bloomfield Hills.

"THE POLICY-MAKING body of our Society is the House of Delegates whose 144 members are elected by local medical societies throughout the State," said President Kenneth H. Johnson of Lansing.

"The statements of policy by the democratic group are truly a cross-section of medical opinion. Members may introduce any number of current problems for consideration, ranging from the need for medical school expansion to a recommendation concerning the general care of our aging population."

On Monday, "Michigan's Foremost Family Physician of 1961" will be selected from candidates nominated by county medical societies.

THE OPINION-SETTING annual meeting of the House of Delegates will open the six-day 90th annual session of the Michigan State Medical Society, Sept. 27 through Sept. 29 will be devoted to a scientific program of post-graduate lectures by 30 nationally-known medical authorities.

Registration is expected to total 3,300.
