ments for possible future remodeling or alteration of existing structures in this area.

V. North side of 13 Mile Road west of gas station at Greenfield.
 Recommendation: Rezone to R-1 (Office, Professional) from presently zoned parking.
 Reasons:
 1. Area impractical for parking (originally intended to provide buffer next to service station).
 2. To provide a much better transition from retail (gas station) to church.

VI. Portion of northeast corner of village.
 Recommendation: Rezone to R-3 single family residential from presently zoned R-2 single family residential.
 Reasons:
 1. To more properly define zoning districts in terms of existing dwelling units.
 2. To lessen hardship that could result from impractical requirements for possible future remodeling or alteration of existing structures in the area.

VII. Portion of area bounded by Southfield to Evergreen and 13 Mile Road to Beverly Road.
 Recommendation: Rezone to R-2 single family residential from presently zoned R-1 single family residential.
 Reasons:
 1. Proximity of 13 Mile Road, village property, park school and retail district on Southfield.
 2. Some R-2 within this area.

VIII. Edgewood Avenue from Lecherie to Birchwood.
 Recommendation: Vacate street right-of-way.
 Reasons:
 1. Practically all has been vacated.
 2. Little or no use of the area as a street.
 3. Presently not maintained as a street and is deteriorating.

 Patrolman Don McLoughlin, who was driving the police car, was not injured.

 The police car attempted to swerve to avoid hitting the motorcycle. Covill flew off the motorcycle, hit the windshield of the police car, then landed in the road.
