

Oakland Dems Move To Strengthen Party

Oakland County Democrats this week initiated an intensified program designed to strengthen the party in the county. The need for such action was stressed at the regular meeting of the Oakland County Democratic Committee Monday night.

"The results of the Con-Con election were indeed saddening," said James N. Ginn, county Democratic chairman. "But they teach us a lot. The opposition," he said, "got out more voters than we did; it's as simple as that. That's why we lost."

He emphasized that there is a need for "more and more youth in the precincts, and more and more money from many more people" if the organization is to achieve victory at the polls.
