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trasts and traditional patterns. Brushed orlons and synthetics will be used lavishly for sweaters and big sisters will continue to load their wardrobes with their beloved shetlands.

ACCESSORIES will include the new cuddle caps which girls of every age will take to with their soft brushed look. Madeline hats of beaver will be sycatchers too. Dog collars theme a mode in belts, with series linked together. Wide-wale corduroy clutch purses vie with so-adult mock needle-pointe bags for little sister and her older counterpart.

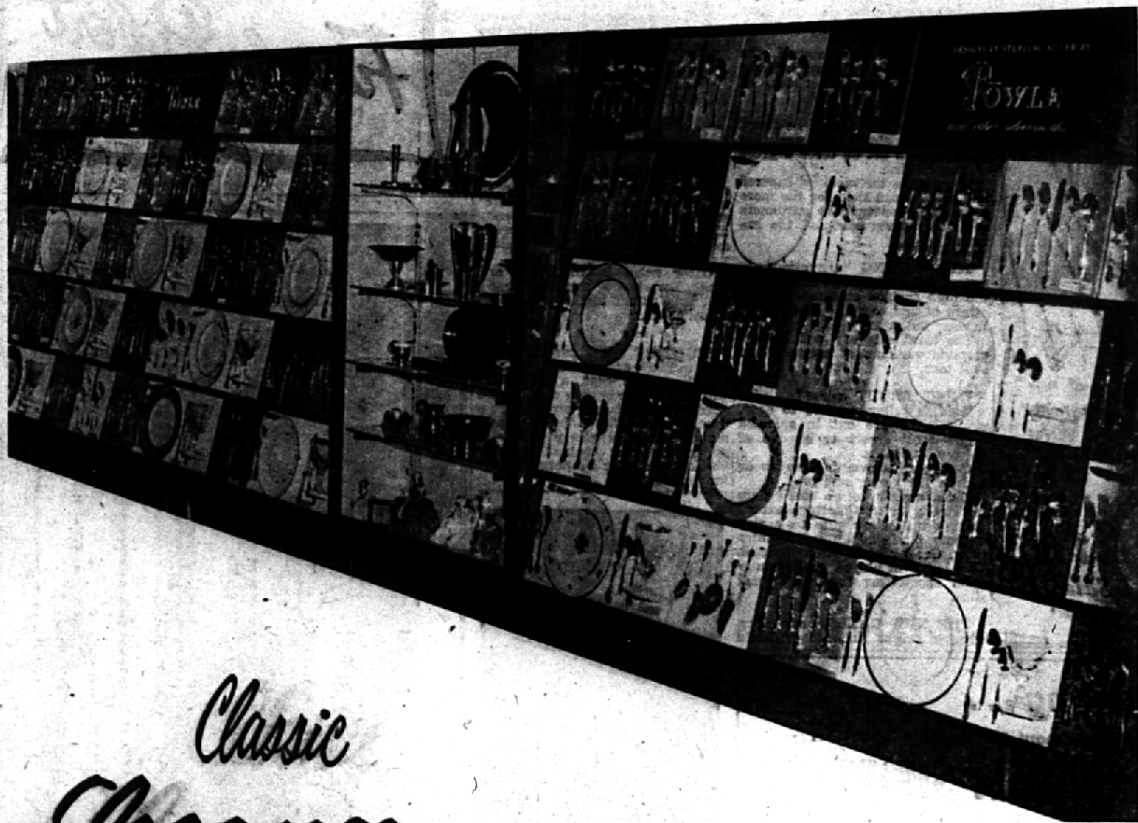
Dress Properly When Out Of The Country
