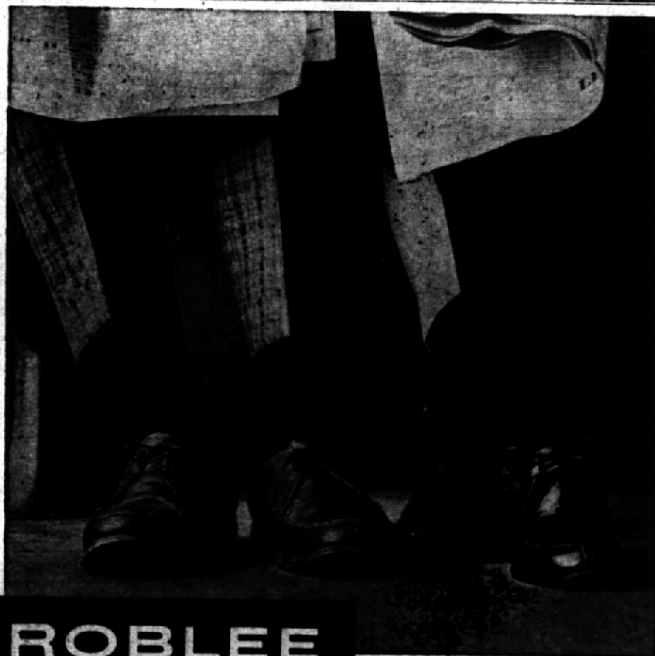
Still going strong in blouses are the cardigan jackets in novelty prints and fabrics. Cotton ruffles, both self and lace are strong... still the sissy influence.
