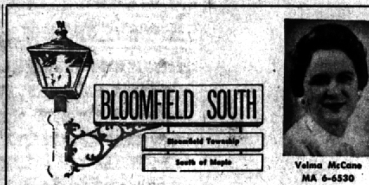
### Auxiliary Gives Membership Tea

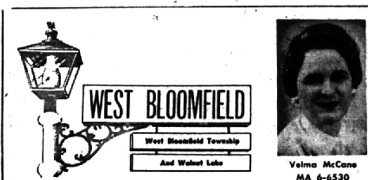
