

### Educators to Meet At MSUO Tonight

About 75 teachers in Region 7 (Oakland County) of the Michigan Department of Classroom Teachers (DCT) will attend a fall regional meeting at Michigan State University Oakland at 5 o'clock tonight.

The largest department of the Michigan Education Association, the DCT has a state-wide membership of some 47,000 classroom teachers.

The highlight of the session will be a discussion of the science research program reading program, a self-directed, individualized reading plan for schools to supplement current instruction in all grades.

Also on the agenda will be formulation of program plans for the 1962-63 school year and discussions of such topics as ethics, the MEA Constitution, and teacher education and professional standards.

### MSUO Grants Total \$100,051

Michigan State University Oakland recently announced it has received two Federal grants and curriculum planning grant from the Ford Motor Co. Fund, totaling \$100,051.

The Ford grant of \$15,630 was made to finance the learning of a "new look" business administration program at MSUO. Dr. Kenneth Rose, associate dean and director of the program, a former senior staff economist for President Eisenhower's Council on Economic Advisors, will seek the advice of leading executives and business educators across the country.

"This new approach to undergraduate business training," Dr. Rose said, "will seek to develop an analytical, self-reliant person, not train him for his first job. The business leader of tomorrow requires strong liberal arts, and science training today."

LARGEST OF THE three grants is one of \$87,457 from the U. S. Office of Education to Dr. Donald D. O'Dowd and David C. Beardslee to expand work on a five-year project seeking to determine the images that college students have of various professions.

This study has already revealed that the doctor, not the business executive, is the most glamorous person and the college students' hero. College professors were found to be least attractive to scientists, industrial managers and accountants were low. Dr. O'Dowd and Beardslee are both psychology professors. Dr. O'Dowd was recently named dean of the university.

THE DISCOVERIES of this inquiry may be useful in the search for the casual carelessness which its primary aim is to learn whether enzyme production is governed in higher organisms (fruit flies) the same way it is in bacterial cells.
