WNFGA Members To Discuss Plans For Coming Year

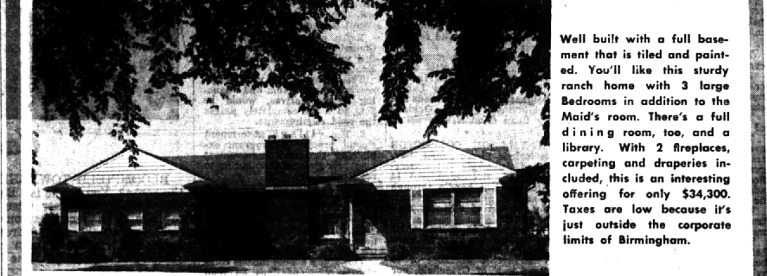

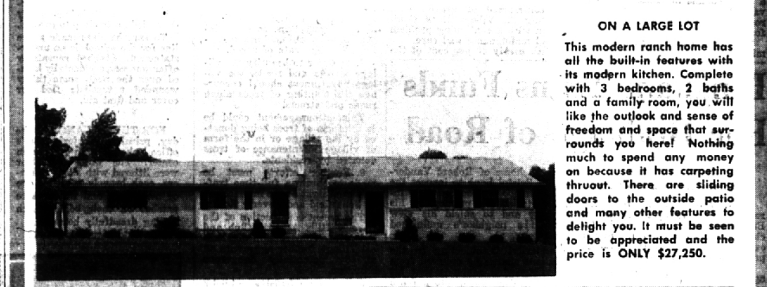
